Directions

Baker Street runs mainly southwards from the London Underground Station of that name (served by a number of lines including the, Bakerloo, Circle and Metropolitan. On the Circle it lies between the main line stations at Paddington to the west and Euston, Kings Cross, St Pancras to the east).

From the station, walk south on the right hand side of the road (you will come across the building with the “Sherlock Holmes” plaque quite quickly) – keep going around half way down the street and no 55 is a large “futuristic” building on a corner plot with a café by the ground floor corner – the office entrance is just past the café and set back from the pavement. Enquire at the reception desk, Stoy Hayward are just up on the first floor.
